

**REWRITING THE HOLOCAUST ONLINE:  
A DISCOURSE ANALYSIS OF HOLOCAUST DENIAL WEB SITES**

*Description:* Holocaust deniers mask their anti-Semitism with pseudo-scientific inquiry and with an anti-Zionist rhetoric. They claim to be politically sieged and their main struggle is for freedom of speech. The results of my study indicate that most Holocaust deniers mask their anti-Semitic views with professionally designed, current, political web sites that are not content-rich, not offensive, or anti-Semitic. Through a discourse analysis of these web page, I will illustrate that if the user analyses the text and the hidden meanings and messages (like meta-text) within the web site, it becomes more apparent that these web sites are anti-Semitic and racist.
